**National Acts**

- **Peter Cetera, Sept 10-** This Grammy Award winning singer/songwriter has succeeded with two profound musical careers. As a distinguished solo artist his hits have included "The Glory of Love" from "The Karate Kid II", "The Next Time I Fall" with Amy Grant, and "After All" with Cher. Prior to his solo career, he was the legendary voice, songwriter, & bass player for the Multi-Platinum group, Chicago.
- **John Waite, Sat. June 5-** If one were asked to sum up the life and music of John Waite in one word, that word would have to be "romantic." From his solo career with the mega hit "Missing You" to his time with The Babys and Bad English, he has been a musical sensation for over 30 years.
- **Eddie Money, Fri. June 18-** Money exploded onto the music scene in the 1970s with the hits, "Baby Hold On," "Two Tickets To Paradise," and "Take Me Home Tonight." With over 28 million records sold worldwide, Eddie Money's trademark husky voice is easily recognized and enjoyed today.
- **The Elders, Wed. July 7-** Take a group of Kansas City musicians with a passion for Celtic music, an Irishman with a love of all things American, and you get a cross-pollination of elements that is high octane and progressive, yet rooted in tradition.

With his own unique style and deep syrupy voice, McKinney has performed throughout the west opening concerts for Kenny Chesney, Rascal Flatts, George Strait, Kenny Loggins, Reba McEntire and many more.
- **Due West, Fri. August 6-** With an independent spirit as great as the American frontier, Due West is staking their claim to Nashville fame. Tim Gates, Brad Hull and Matt Lopez comprise the energetic young band based on tight three-part harmony and smart, sincere songwriting.
- **David Wilcox, Sat. Sept. 18-** Wilcox performs solo acoustic and loves music for how it has tuned up his life. More than just entertainment, music has been a compass to navigate a life worth singing about. He delivers what his audiences want: Music that connects with their hearts and souls.
